A Work Support Success Story

Charlie is a good natured, easy going member of our Sunrise Community Connections program in Machias. He is also a successful employee in our Work Support Program. Charlie cleans the Sunrise Opportunities building at 232 Court Street, Machias which houses the Washington County Children's Program, the Washington County CAN Prevention Council, the Dental Program,



Counseling Services and Community Integration Services. I followed Charlie during his work day and asked him a few questions. He told me he works 2 hours every Wednesday. He completes tasks on a check list. Charlie told me some of those tasks are taking out the trash, wiping down door knobs, checking toilet paper to be refilled, sweeping and mopping the floors, cleaning the bathroom mirrors and refill the soap dispensers. When asked what he likes about working Charlie responded "I love this job!" I asked if there was anything he didn't like and he said "No." I asked how having a job makes him feel and he softly replied "Good." Charlie said he likes earning a weekly pay check and uses the money for fun activities such as going out to eat. Charlie said his Work Support staff Adam, assists him on the job by helping to make sure he accomplishes all the tasks on his checklist. Dixie, who works

at the Court Street office, said "I can attest that Charlie shows up to work every week in good spirits and is eager to get to work. He is polite and professional while working. He always lets us know when we are running low on cleaning supplies or if there are any other issues that may need to be taken care of. We are all grateful for the work that Charlie does. He takes pride in a job well done and it is reflected in the end results." When Charlie isn't working he enjoys mowing lawns and volunteers his time at the Machias Fire Department where he washes the trucks and sweeps out the base. Keep up the great job Charlie!
